Tickets for Kids[®] Charities invited to White House Astronomy Night

Pittsburgh — (October 19, 2015) Tickets for Kids[®] Charities' (TFK) Executive Director Jason J. Riley will be a guest of President Barack Obama at <u>White House Astronomy Night</u> on Monday, October 19th in Washington D.C. According to the White House blog, the event "will bring together scientists, engineers, and visionaries from astronomy and the space industry to share their experiences with students and teachers as they spend an evening stargazing from the South Lawn."
